Middletown Town Council Adopts Resolution Urging the General Assembly to Close the State's Prostitution Loophole

The *Newport Daily News* ran a front page story on Monday nights' Middletown Council Meeting. See the attachment for the full article. (Thank you to Senator DiPalma for sending me a copy of the story.)

Citizens Against Trafficking is pleased that the Middletown Town Council unanimously passed a resolution that calls for the passage of a prostitution law in Rhode Island. Unfortunately, the resolution has no details on what type of a law should be passed. It does not mention that the law against prostitution must be at the misdemeanor level in order for law enforcement to vigorously investigate and to get Rhode Island included in FBI investigations of the sex trafficking of children.

Senator Lou DiPalma continues to assure people that he supports a prostitution law, but has not withdrawn his support for the Senate bill that decriminalizes pimping activity. The current Senate bill does not "close the loophole," although some people continue to say that it does.
